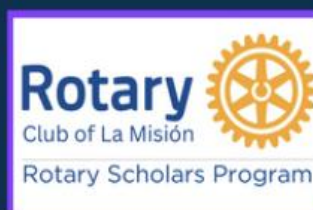

ROTARY SCHOLARS PROGRAM MISSION

We believe that education is the key to empowering individuals and building strong communities. That's why the La Misión Rotary Scholars Program focuses on providing financial support to local students seeking advanced training and degrees. Our goal is to foster the development of a new generation of leaders who are committed to making a difference in their communities.

TARGET POPULATION

The Rotary Scholars Program assists students from the club's service area (La Misión, Santa Anita, Santa Rosa, Alisitos, Primo Tapia, Úrsula Galván, and Baja Mar) who need financial assistance beyond sources currently available to complete the post secondary degrees required for their chosen career. Recipients must:

- Maintain strong academic performance of 8.0 or higher,
- Demonstrate the Rotary commitment to serve through volunteer activities of service to the community.

APPLICATION PROCESS

Interested students will go the Rotary Scholars website (RotaryScholarsProgram.org) and in the Solicitar Beca tab and fill out the personal data form included below. In addition, applicants write a personal essay according to the provided guidelines (see below). Currently, the RSP is focused on students from CECyTE Primo Tapia as this is the most underserved high school in the area in terms of university scholarships.

APPLICATION ESSAY

We would love to get to know you as a scholarship applicant and to share your story with others to raise scholarship funds. Please help us by writing a one-page essay about your life.

First, give your name, what you are studying and which university you are attending.

Then, select 3 or 4 of the questions below and answer them to complete your essay.

- What does receiving a scholarship mean to your education?
- What career are you working toward and why did you choose it?
- What is your plan after graduation?
- What are your dreams for the future?
- Who has given you inspiration or offered help?
- What was it like growing up in this area?
- What are your experiences in college?
- What jobs have you had while you are in school?
- Who inspired you to go to university?
- What are your interests and hobbies?
- What is your passion?
- What service projects have you done in your community?
- What is your favorite class or teacher and why?
- What are obstacles to your education?
- What are your short-term and long-term goals?

- 1) Complete your essay.
- 2) Translate your essay into English. You can use Google Translate if you wish.
- 3) Attach both the Spanish and English versions to an email and send to:

We will share of your story with the selection committee of the Rotary Scholars program so make sure your essay is interesting and informative. We want everyone to know how great you are!

Please look at the samples below to help spark your creative thinking.

Selection Process – All members of the RSP committee

1. General discussion of selection criteria and priorities
 - a. Live in the service area
 - b. Need financial assistance to pay tuition
 - c. Enrolled/accepted by university and major department
 - d. GPA of 8.0 or higher
 - e. Demonstrated record of service (esp. returning students)
2. Discussion of funds available and funding amounts. This may change year-to-year, especially in the beginning, depending on the amount of money we have and the number of applicants.
 - a. RSP committee will decide how much will be expended and how much will be held in reserve.
 - b. Scholarships in the amount of \$4000 pesos/semester will be awarded until allocated funds are expended.
 - c. NOTE: Amount of scholarship will not exceed amount of tuition
3. Each student's full application packet will be printed and available.
4. Evaluation team will work in pairs
 - a. Triage – Remove applicants who don't meet criteria
 - b. Identify very strong applicants- place in award pile
 - c. Remaining applicants will be deliberated and awards made according to the decision of the committee.
 - d. Final recipients and amounts will be decided by the selection team.
5. All applicants notified of funding decision and the next steps for them to take to receive the funds.

Fund Distribution Method

Funds will be distributed in:

Semester Programs – October and January
Quarter Programs – October, January, and May

Recipients will bring:

1. Service Documentation –

- Written description of what you did and what you learned (1-2 pages) include pictures and/or video
- Prepare a short presentation (2-3 minutes) to Rotary Club (Live, poster presentation or via video)

2. Official copy of grades from past semester

3.. Receipt for payment of fees for current semester

- For cash reimbursements

4. Government issued ID to be scanned as 501(c)3 verification.

Rotary will bring:

- 1. Cash or payment type- discussed below**
- 2. Cell phone photo to scan necessary records**

Fund Distribution Meeting room will be set up in 3 areas. Student proceeds to each center in order.

1st General Info. Center - Check contact information is current, get photo release signed, get copy of grades.

2nd Service Center – Turn in documentation and verification of service work and develop upcoming service plan.

3rd Payment Center - Rotary Purser receives receipt for payment of fees from current semester, distributes funds in the matter decided upon and has recipient sign for them.

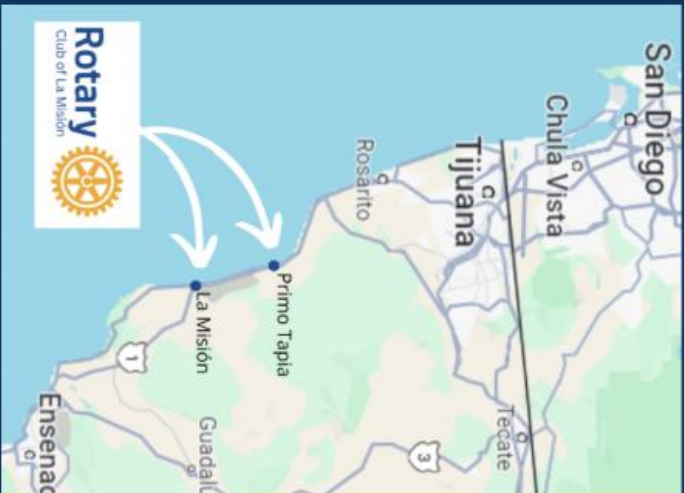

The donors are introduced to the Scholars as they enter the program through the bi-monthly, Scholar produced Newsletter.

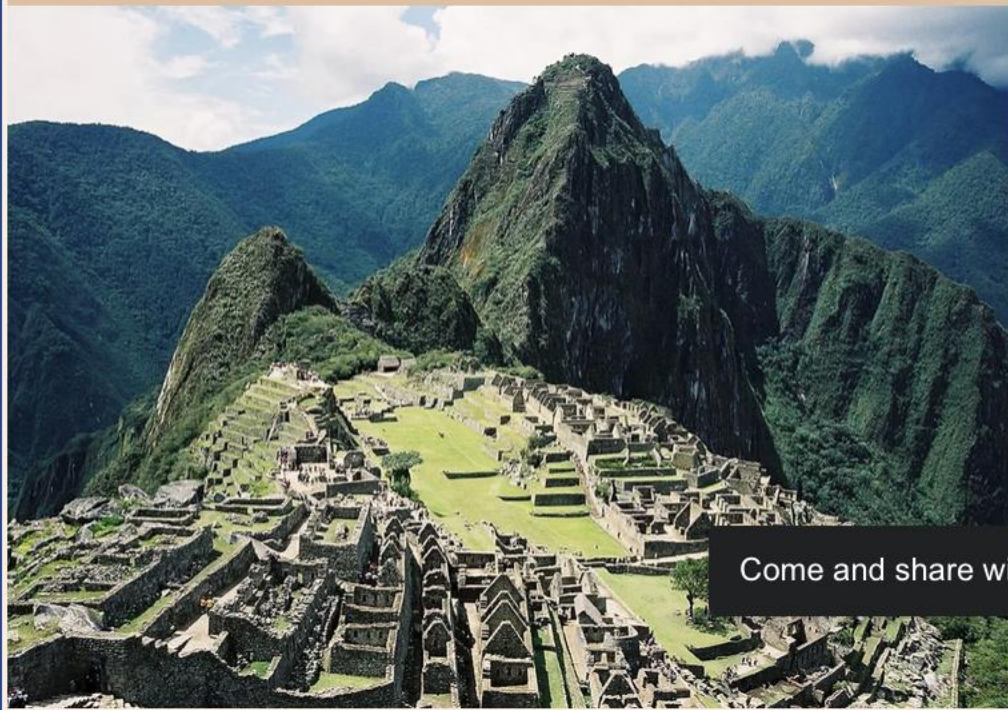
Scholarships can be made in honor of or in memory of a loved one. We have a memorial scholarship funded by our club in memory of one of our dedicated members who recently passed away.
